

TO GARLESTOWN, OR KIRKCUDBRIGHT,

Every Wednesday Morning; returning the same Day.

TO DOUGLAS IN THE ISLE OF MAN,

The Isle of Man on account of the purity of its water, the fineness of the beach, and the cheapness of all the luxuries, as well as the necessities of life, has become celebrated for Sea Bathing, and is now the central connecting point of the Steam Navigation of the Channel, there being daily conveyances of that description to and from Liverpool, Port Patrick, and Glasgow; weekly to Newry, Belfast, and other Ports, as well as by the St. Andrew to and from Dublin, Whitehaven, Dumfries, &c.
