MEDICAL CONTRACTS.

THE Board of Guardians of the Whitehaven Union do hereby give Notice, that at their Weekly Meeting, to be held on THURSDAY the 23d Day of March next, they will proceed to Contract for MEDICINES and MEDICAL and SURGICAL ATTENDANCE on the Paupers, resident in the following Districts of the Union, viz:—

1st.—*Whitehaven District*—comprising the Township of Whitehaven and the Whitehaven Workhouse, containing a Population of 12,107 Persons, at a Salary of £40 per Annum.

2d.—*Harrington District*—comprising the Parishes of Arlecdon, Distington, Harrington, Lamplugh, Moreaby, Parton, and Weddies, containing a Population of 5519 Persons, at a Salary of £25 per Annum.

3d.—*Egremont District*—comprising the Parishes of Egremont, Cleator, St. Bees, Ennerdale and Kinniside, Haile, Saint Johns, Lowside Quarter, Rottington, and Sandwith, containing a Population of 4912 Persons, at a Salary of £21 per Annum.

4th.—*Preston Quarter District*—comprising the Parishes of Preston Quarter and Hensingham, and Preston Quarter Workhouse, containing a Population of 5682 Persons, at a Salary of £20 per Annum.

5th.—*Gosforth District*—comprising the Parishes of Gosforth, Saint Bridgets, Ponsoby, and Nether-wassdale, containing a Population of £117 Persons, at a Salary of £12 per Annum.

In addition to the above Salaries, the Medical Officers will be remunerated by the Board of Guardians for the Operations and Services performed by them for any Out-door Pauper, of the following Classes of Operations, viz:—

- 1st—Amputation of Leg, Arm, Foot, or Hand
- 2d—The Operation for Strapped Hernia.
- 3d—The Operation of Trephining for Fractured Skull
- 4th—Treatment of Compound Fractures of the Thigh
- 5th—Treatment of Compound Fractures, or Compound Dislocations of the Legs

6th.—Treatment of Simple Fractures, or Simple Dislocation of the Thigh or Leg. } £5
7th.—Treatment of Dislocations, or Fractures of the Arm

The above Rates to include the Payment for the supply of all kinds of Apparatus and Splints.

All Trusses supplied by the Medical Officers to be paid for by the Board of Guardians, at the original Cost Price, including Carriage.

The Delivery of any Pauper Woman in Childbirth, and subsequent Medical Attendance upon her by any Medical Officer, whether in or out of the Workhouse, will be paid for by the Board of Guardians as follows, viz:—

For a Delivery in ordinary Cases, Attendance, and Medicine, the Sum of Ten Shillings.

But in any Special Case, in which great Difficulty may have occurred in Delivery, or long subsequent Attendance may have been requisite, the sum of Two Pounds, subject to the Regulations in Articles 12 and 13 of the Poor Law Commissioners' Medical Order, dated 12th of March, 1842.

The Contracts to commence on the 26th March, 1843, for such a Period as the Board of Guardians shall fix upon.

Medical Gentlemen, duly Qualified, are requested to deliver Written and Sealed Letters, specifying for which of the said Districts in which they reside, or nearly adjoin, they wish to become Candidates, at my Office in Whitehaven, on or before Thursday the 16th Day of March Instant, by Ten o'Clock; and on Thursday, 23d of March, then following, Appointments to the respective Districts will be declared, when an Agreement will be required to be Signed for the due Performance of the Contracts.

The Poor Law Commissioners' Medical Order above-mentioned, may be inspected, and further Particulars may be had, on Application at my Office.
